Sullivan County, P.I.N. 975	County Road 53 over the Neversink River, BIN 3355530, Town of Fallsburg, 2.57 (the "Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as poportionment of the costs of such program at the ratio of 80% Federal and
WHEREAS, the County of	Sullivan desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% or

WHEREAS, the County of Sullivan desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the Federal and non-Federal share of the Preliminary Engineering/Design, Right-of-Way Incidentals, Right-of-Way Acquisition, Construction and Construction Supervision and Inspection work; and

WHEREAS, Resolutions 17-03, 178-05, 248-08, 100-11 and 217-13 previously authorized and appropriated \$433,672 for Preliminary Engineering, Right-of-Way Incidental and Right-of-Way Acquisition work.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Legislature hereby approves of the Project and authorizes the County Treasurer to pay in the first instance 100% of the Federal and non-Federal share of the Construction and Construction Supervision and Inspection work for the project or portions thereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sum of \$ 3,566,000 is hereby appropriated in budget items D5020-40-4006 AND D5110-46-40-4038 for payment of the Construction and Construction Supervision and Inspection work; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sullivan owns a parcel of land depicted on the Real Property Tax Map in the Town of Liberty, shown as Section 25, Block 1, Lot 13.1; and

WHEREAS, NYSEG is requesting an easement to enter on the described property along Elk Point Road to facilitate the upgrade; and
