Center for Workforce Development Highlights

- 1. The NYS Dept of Labor is in receipt of a National Emergency Grant (NEG) that will make available \$6.4 million statewide for On-the-Job Training (OJT) contracts with businesses. An OJT is designed to be a "win-win" for the employer and the employee. Through this grant, private sector businesses hiring eligible job seekers will qualify for wage reimbursements for up to six months. Percent of wages to be reimbursed is based on total number of full time employees before the hiring of an OJT/NEG participants:
 - 1-50 employees = up to 90% reimbursement
 - 51-250 employees = up to 75% reimbursement
 - More than 250 employees = up to 50% reimbursement

The jobs must be full-time, permanent and pay at least the minimum wage of \$7.25/hour. Reimbursement will not exceed the hourly rate of \$24.42/hr. Other requirements apply. Eligible individuals must be unemployed for 27 weeks or more and meet the guidelines outlined in the local OJT policy. - 2. Under the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012, eligible laid off workers received extended unemployment compensation. This is scheduled to end on December 31, 21012. As of the week beginning September 2, 2012, there are 563 Sullivan County extended unemployment compensation recipients who will exhaust their benefits by the end of the year if they do not find a job or if there are no new extensions passed by Congress.

 Program Year 2011 (July 1, 211 June 30, 2012)
 - 3,535 participants received WIA services at the One Stop Center
 - Self Directed Services 1,369 participants
 (Career Center computers, fax, phones etc for job search)
 - Staff Assisted Core Services 1,675 participants
 (job search assistance, labor market information, support services, assessment, job listings, resume development)
 - Intensive Services 1,498 participants
 (short term pre-vocational training, individual employment plan development, career counseling, work readiness, work experience, case management)
 - Training Services 301 participants (classroom or on-the-job (OJT))

Youth program – 40 youth served (education, training, case management, assessment, paid work experience, paid internships, support services, job placement)

4. Welfare to Work

For the period January 1, 2012 – August 31, 2012

1,146 individuals were referred to CWD

Of those, 613 (TANF 55%; Safety Net 45%) showed for orientation and received intensive services.

For July and August, 2012

252 individuals were referred to CWD

Of those, 130 (TANF 59%; Safety Net 41%) showed for orientation and received intensive services. Of those, 42 individuals (32%) had never applied for public assistance.



<u>ACTIVITY REPORT – OCTOBER 2012</u> COUNTY OF SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

September 28, 2012

In September, the IDA approved one US Department of Agriculture Rural Microentrepreneur Assistance Program (RMAP) loan. That loan was approved for Catskill Harvest Marketplace in the Town of Liberty to predominately purchase equipment for the retail store.

Work to list all the RMAP projects, the status of those projects, and the quarterly status report of the loan/grant fund was accomplished on the USDA LINC website. A quarterly drawdown of funds was requested and received. Numerous closings on past approved loans also occurred in September.

Bids for the excavating work on the Red Meat Facility were opened on September 4, 2012, and the low bidder, Sullivan County Paving, was approved by the IDA Board on September 25. All work was coordinated with the Department of Commerce, as required by the USDA grant fund. Work continued on transferring the Ag LDC grants to the IDA and on the dissolution of the Ag LDC sub-agency known as SCALD.

The IDA held regular and special meetings in September to accomplish this work.

Public, County, State, and Federal requests for information, new loan applicant questions, and coordination of activities all occurred in September.

Work continued on the draft 2013 budgets for the IDA and the Sullivan County Funding Corporation (SCFC). A public hearing will be held as public outreach in October for both these budgets.

The company representative has visited an inspected the facility though still small for the overall needs of the company. They continue to search in Delaware and Orange County. - SCVA'S 2012 Visitors Guide is being distributed to visitors centers, web and 800 requests and ad placement requests.
- The Big Eddy Film Festival was a wonderful event and well attended for the first year. Plans are underway for next year exploring expansion.
- Fall foliage reports are being done weekly to NYS and posted on the SCVA web site.
- TrailKeeper.org was unveiled and received over 5,000 page views in four days. Reviews of the site are very positive.
- SCVA is exploring new programs for the promotion of Sullivan County for 2013. Exploring new international and domestic marketing plans and familiarization tours with partners.
- SCVA has finalized the pilot program involving our Sullivan County Ag community supplying agricultural product to major food service operations in Westchester. SCVA will be attending a "Taste Our Local Harvest Event" in Westchester with several of our local producers including Tonja's, Samba's and Catskill Distillery to promote Sullivan County Catskills product to a large market in Westchester. Success in this market will open up future markets for produce made here.
- Press stories that have made the news: "thebestfifty.com" to name Peace Vodka Number 1 in a national taste test of independent distillery spirits; golf article on Concord "Monster" by writer from Westchester golf with a follow up in the spring on the new developments at the site.

- SCVA is working with several community minded advocates to create new ideas that will spawn county-wide events. The Rugged Run for Respect event at Holiday Mountain recently initiated talks with a group that is planning on creating several new events at the site for 2013.
- SCVA has been working with the NYS and CATS public relations firm to promote various events and attractions in the Sullivan County Catskills including Harvest Festivals, special events, farm to fork and others during the fall and shoulder seasons.
- SCVA has seen tremendous success with the weekly e-blast. It continues to drive traffic to the SCVA main site, Catskill Social and especially to the various events and businesses featured each week.
- Several specific videos are being produce through SCVA's relations with the NYS CVB to be available on web site in the near future.
- The new sign in front of SCVA office is drawing additional visitor traffic into our fully stocked visitors' center. We have had guests from various states across the country.
- SCVA continues to update and work on Governor Cuomo's Statewide Pathway to History project. This project will place signage on the major corridors leading into the county.
- SCVA is working regionally and statewide on tourism funding through various funding opportunities.
- SCVA has mailed out our annual Member and non-Member Profile forms to enable us to update our website listings and this will update the State and regional sites as well.
- SCVA attended the Sullivan County Chamber Business Expo.
