ACTIVITY REPORT –NOVEMBER 2017 COUNTY OF SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, SULLIVAN COUNTY FUNDING CORPORATION, THE SULLIVAN COUNTY INFRASTRUCTURE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

At its regular monthly meeting in November, the County of Sullivan IDA Board approved an extension of the sales tax exemption period for the Villa Roma Resort & Conference Center project. This extension will facilitate the continued construction and development of the project, in accordance with IDA agreements.

Recently the IDA has been working to assist commercial solar generation projects through its new Community Distributed Generation Uniform Tax Exempt Policy, adopted in December 2016. On November 10, the IDA and NY Delaware I, LLC closed on a commercial solar generation project to be located in the Town of Delaware. On November 22, the IDA and NY Liberty I, LLC closed on a solar project to be located in the Town of Liberty. A third solar project application, for a project to be located in the Town of Delaware, has been received and is pending IDA review and approval.

IDA staff continues to prepare for year-end data collection and reporting. This work will be a major focus through February 2018. Likewise, we have begun the process of collecting payments in lieu of taxes from over 45 projects. These payments will be distributed to the taxing jurisdictions in accordance with the projects' IDA agreements and New York State Law. PILOT and employment information, as well as other details about IDA, must be submitted to the New York State Authorities Budget Office via the Public Authorities Reporting System (PARIS). Staff will being compiling and submitting this information. PARIS filings are also required for the Sullivan County Funding Corporation and The Sullivan County Infrastructure Local Development Corporation.

IDA's staff and CEO continue to work with the Sullivan County Planning Division, Sullivan County Partnership for Economic Development, and other agency partners to foster the development and expansion of businesses through loans, tax abatements, and related forms of assistance.

Sullivan County Partnership Monthly Report-December

A. General Operations

- It has been a busy month since our last report. A steady flow and variety of projects are being worked on at this time they include the following:
 - o Boutique Hotel Development
 - o International Distillery
 - o Two market place housing developments
 - o Specialty Dairy Producer
 - o NYC based Specialty Yogurt Producer
 - o Back office administration facility for a regional non-profit
 - o Drone manufacturer and flight school
 - o Metal Fabricator
 - o Mid market hotel development
 - o NYC based micro brewery

This activity at this time of year is indicative of sustained interest in Sullivan County and speaks to the growing momentum and reality that this is the next place to invest in and achieve economic success over the next several decades. It will continue our trajectory to new investment, tax ratables, jobs, and the secondary and tertiary positive impacts it will have on our economy and municipal budgets that have long been under pressure for years to come. For those who may see this with a sense of exuberant precaution, I remind you that Sullivan County can grow its developed area 35% before significantly impacting open space or our way of life in any perceived negative way. To put that in perspective, 35% growth in developed are will not happen in our life time or that of our children. The amount of developed land in Sullivan County's near 1,000 sq. miles is just over 5%.

We are in the running for a 100,000 sq. ft European distillery inquiry. The firm will employ 200+ people. Principals from the company have visited Sullivan County twice with ESD representatives. The President /CEO visited the second time with interest in locating near the SUNY Sullivan in order work with the college for employee training purposes. They met with SUNY Sullivan President Jay Quaintance and were taken with the campus and the potential opportunities

there. Awaiting a decision. Update: We are in the running and have been providing cost estimate data relative to construction, infrastructure needs, utilities needs etc., to the firm so that they may provide data to NYESD for incentive application purposes. In other words we are being seriously considered for this project in a very competitive environment.

 A hotel group that visited the Grossinger's site this summer has informed us that they remain committed to moving forward with a potential project there. They are completing due diligence at this time. Update: Involved parties are negotiating terms.

B. **Project Updates**

a. Corporate Attraction

- · We met with a developer and principals representing the Grossinger's property. The developer is interested in former hotel properties featuring a signature golf course as well as the potential for other amenities. Update: interest remains, in due diligence phase at this time. Terms are being negotiated.
- We have received an inquiry for a large distillery interested in locating to New York. The facility may be as large as 100,000sq. ft with ancillary equipment included. The site consultant is seeking both existing facilities and green space options. See comments above.
- We have met with a representative of a group interested an aviation related project at the SC Airport. Deputy Depew has been very helpful with this project as he has expertise in this area. The group has since brought principals to Sullivan County, where Deputy Depew provided an excellent comprehensive presentation on the elements/assets that comprise the airport and its operational situation. The group has also met with SUNY Sullivan for workforce training purposes and is very interested in moving forward as a

result.

- A manufacturer of aluminum framing products for store front facades will be locating to Sullivan County. The facility will be 10,000sq.ft and provide product to NYC clients. We have shown the Glenwild Industrial Park as well as other available locations. This would continue to add to our value added specialty metal fabrication cluster. The firm has expressed interest in moving forward.
- We have met with a specialty NYC based specialty yogurt producer. The firm produces all natural hormone free yogurt and has an accelerating market following. Local dairy sourcing is critical to their success among other factors.
- A NYC based micro brewery is interested in locating to Sullivan County. All
 indications are that the group is well financed and produces a quality product
 in high demand.
- We have met with a firm that constructs custom homes out of shipping containers. The firm is looking for space to streamline and simplify manufacturing component of his process. Four homes have been constructed in Sullivan County to date. A story in New York Times featuring the product has created a significant spike in demand.

b. Small Business/Entrepreneurial Development

- · We have met and are assisting a small restaurant located on Broadway in Monticello.
- We have assisted both Seminary Hill Cider and Catskill Distilling with their respective ESD CFA applications. Both will be investing in facilities, equipment and jobs further enhancing our growing food and beverage industry. Catskill will be applying for marketing money for a special event initiative as well. Awaiting decision announcement. Ongoing
- · We have met with a firm that is interested in a shrimp raising facility. The facility will be indoors in a controlled atmospheric environment. The company is currently selling product to New York City restaurants from its current location. We have shown five locations for the 1st of three twenty five thousand sq. ft facilities that will be needed for the operation and its expansion. Developing.....

c. Business Expansion

• We are assisting a local/regional non-profit that will be centralizing 50 jobs in a newly constructed health care related administration facility in Sullivan

County. The firm representatives are interested in LEED certified facility to be built in the Rock Hill area.

A local manufacturer will be investing in a new plant on a former food processing site. The plant will be producing metal racking systems for shelving, warehouse storage and other uses. The investment will bring dollars being spent outside of the US here to Sullivan County in the form of investment, jobs and a permanent ratable. We have assisted the company in a request for Empire State Development incentives. There has been substantial activity at the location thus far. Update: the project is moving forward steadily. Special thanks to Mid Hudson Region ESD offices for their assistance. Update: we will be hosting a special event marking the opening of the facility later this fall. Ongoing.

d. Shovel Ready Sites

- We have received all but one executed agreement for this project which is forth coming shortly. When received will be invoicing for committed funds and sending out RFQs for the project to prospective engineering firms. Ongoing.
- e.
