**SEASONAL FT FARMERS MARKET COORDINATORS (2): June-November, \$18.85ph.** Sullivan Fresh Markets rotate across 8 sites throughout Sullivan County. We are seeking dynamic, engaging, energetic Market Coordinators to work our farmers markets to ensure smooth operations and efficiency. This includes picking up, packing, loading, unloading, setting up, selling, local farm and food products into the mobile market van, properly sanitizing all supplies and equipment, operating a point of service (POS) machine, and completing sales paperwork. We are hiring two seasonal (June 26-November 10) full-time positions at 35-40 hours per week. Clean driving record of at least 3 years preferred. **CAREGIVER RESOURCE CENTER COORDINATOR: \$22.50ph.** This position will provide organization, coordination, and management of all aspects of the Caregiver Resource Center Program including CRC group programming; caregiver support; CRC resource and referral; annual Senior Expo, annual Senior Safety Day; intergenerational activities; Tai Chi for Fall Prevention; and other Caregiver Educational Programs administered by Cornell Cooperative Extension Sullivan County.

**AG PROGRAM ASSISTANT: \$20.95ph.** Provides overall support to the Sullivan Fresh Program with food procurement, straightforward inventory management, customer service, marketing and outreach and general record keeping. This position requires driving and must have a valid driver's license meeting our insurance standards.

**FOOD SYSTEMS PROGRAM MANAGER: \$55,380 annually.** Responsible for the direction, management, and coordination of programs that aim to improve access to local foods to reduce food insecurity, prevent and/or postpone the onset of diet-related chronic disease, promote health equity among vulnerable populations and support local agricultural economic development. In Sullivan County, this includes, the Fruit and Vegetable Prescription Program and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP Ed), and other local wholesale and retail non-profit food distribution outlets such as food hubs, County Farmers Markets and the Sullivan Fresh farmers' market and mobile farmers market
