- Grant Update
 - Farmers Market Promotion Grant awarded to the County. CCE has \$20,000 subcontract to assist with market manager coordination
 - Youth Bureau applied, hope to receive between \$4-5,000
 - Applied for a 4-H/youth Peer Mediation, leadership. grant with Ulster and Dutchess. In Sullivan County the grant would cover Monticello School District -\$117,000 per year x 5 years
 - Applied for a USDA grant for Beginner Farmer and Forestry This would cover programming/staff in Horticulture and Forestry \$120,000 per year x 3 years
 - DASNY Capital Improvement Grant due this week can apply for up to \$500,000
 - Engaged Cornell Project Applied for an Intern team to come to SC to research the disparities in services, opportunities, and supports availability and access between the general population and seniors – now in phase II looking for faculty to join the project
 - Cornell led 4-H and Immigrant Children Research Project coming to Sullivan County this summer
- SBN Update
 - SBN is looking at different ways to run the 4-H Horse Program every county is struggling with all the requirements (more than any other animal program) working on a new approach
- CCE will be recording a monthly hour long WJFF program
- We have the opportunity to do a monthly WSUL & WVOS short spot. Board members and volunteers sought to do these spots.
- Currently we are doing two weekly spots on Thunder Country Radio one live, one recorded. Board members and volunteers sought to fill some Monday spots.
- Colleen is hoping to meet one on one with each Legislator to update/introduce them to CCE
- Plan to offer a Spring Ag Tour for Legislators and other elected officials in partnership with Ag Task Force
